LPC Presentation Schedule 2006 - 2009

Core Programs

Core programs are those organizations either directly impacting LPC implemented programs/plans, and who may also be mandated by contract to provide regular reporting to the LPC, or agencies with whom the LPC may collaborate to promote the Child Care Plan. Additionally, core programs may present items from time to time before the Council.

Rotating Programs

Rotating programs are organizations and agencies within the county with whom the LPC does not have a reporting mandate. However, in order to gain an informed overview of child care and related issues in Sacramento County, the Committee agreed it is important for Council Members to learn about these agencies and their impact on child care. Rotating programs make presentations to the LPC once every three years.
